

MEETING MINUTES

March 6, 2025 - General Membership Meeting 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm Virtual

1. Call to Order, 6:30pm

Review and approval of the agenda and the minutes from the previous meeting. Jenna made a motion to approve the agenda and minutes. Richard seconded the motion. The Agenda and Minutes were approved.

2. Principal Updates - Tony Widder, Principal

- c. Mrs. McCurdy asked if the support teachers knew about money available to them. There are some new teachers that have started after August and may not be aware of funds. Mr. Widder will provide update to Richard of new staff so we can reach out to them
- Balls on Playground During Recess, Jenna Hickey, Member at Large 5. Is there a school wide policy/history of balls being allowed and or provided by the school during recess?
 - Direct donations to teachers of balls, supplies would be very helpful. It would be best to supply each classroom vs. having a communal supply. Jenna will put together a Google document to survey what is needed and send to the teachers.
- 6. Approved Mural Grant Update - Elise Bortz, Chair

We conducted a vote amongst the Board for theme ideas and we had a total of 13 votes.

-The designs with the most votes were Lean into Challenges, I can do hard things (6 votes) and Good Things Grow Here (5 votes)

Discussed that based on votes we would like a mural that had less words so it isn't too busy and the younger kids can read it; it should be vibrant and include characteristics specific to River Park Elementary School.

We will send the chosen theme ideas to Max and pay the \$1000 deposit and ask him to come up with 3 rough sketches at the Spring Carnival for people to vote on. Mr. Widder will reach out to Max to coordinate the timeline. We discussed having student artists but determined it might be easier for Max to just complete the mural and answer questions as students walk by.

7. Spring Carnival Updates - Elise Bortz, Chair

We still need a lot of volunteers. Amelia will gather book donations for the book walk. Jenna will be preparing the auction and raffle tables. Jessica will prepare the spirit wear table (work the table or get volunteers to help). The OHS Robotics team will join unless they make it the World Championship which is on the same date. We will have 2 face painters from Kathi's Clowns. Animal Park will have animals they will be exhibiting. Ms. Casey will be having an art show and sale in the gym. Ms. McCurdy will be having the Science Presentation inside as well.

-We still need to make a new map and confirm location of Plinko and ask if we can borrow Ms. Wilsons sound system. We will need chairs, tables and coolers from the school set up for the event.
